America 250: Census Math



- Review the historical U.S. population data.
- Calculate the percent change in population between each pair of years.
- **Graph** the population growth over time using a line graph.



United States of America: Census Data Percent of Change over Time





• **1790**: 3.9 million

• **1850**: 23.2 million

• **1900**: 76.2 million

• **1950**: 151.3 million

2000: 281.4 million

• 2020: 331.4 million







Calculating the Percent of Change

- 1790-1850: +494.87%
- 1850-1900: +228.45%
- 1900-1950: +98.56%
- 1950-2000: +85.99%
- 2000-2020: +17.77%







Create a Line Graph
